

# Badin Hall Packing List 🐸

## ROOM:

- Rug (best to buy after you've seen your room)
- Refrigerator (under 5 cubic feet)
- Futon/comfy chairs
- A fan (or maybe two or three of different sizes!) – this is a necessity since dorm rooms in Badin do not have AC! But don't worry about not being able to find a cool space: the entire first floor, all floor lounges, and study rooms have air conditioning
- Laundry basket and laundry detergent
- Hangers/closet organizers
- Sheets/Blankets/Comforter/Pillows (all bedding should be TWIN EXTRA LONG)
- Mattress Pad- seriously, these will make your bed SO much more comfortable (TWIN EXTRA LONG)
- Bath towels and dish towels
- Reusable water bottle (there are bottle fillers on every floor in Badin and can be found in most campus buildings), you may also like to have a microwave safe bowl or plate and silverware
- Dish soap
- Paper towels/tissues
- Extra storage containers (box cubby shelves are great)
- Clip-on shelf for lofted bed
- Small mirror or over-the-door full length mirror so you don't always have to share the sink mirror with your roommate
- Keurig (all lounges in Badin have small Keurigs, though!)
- Extra lighting (desk lamp or decorative string lights)
- 3M Command hooks and strips (these are a great way to hang decorations and pictures in your room without damaging the walls!)
- Blanket for outside – during extremely warm days, it's nice to sit on the quad with friends and hang out (and maybe do some homework)

## STUDY:

- Laptop & charger
- Headphones
- Binders (large 3-ring binders are especially important for loose-leaf textbooks)
- Agenda/Notebooks/Folders
- Pens/Pencils/Highlighters/Sharpies
- Backpack
- Calculator (nice to have simple and graphing calculators in case professors have different rules)
- Post-Its/Index cards
- Drawer organizers/Desk organizers
- Scissors/3-hole punch/Tape/Stapler
- Thumbtacks (your desk has a bulletin board!)
- Extension cords (three pronged, grounded and insulated)

## BATH:

- Shower caddy
- Flip flops/shower shoes (very important!)
- Shampoo/Conditioner/Body wash/Shaving supplies/Facewash
- Towels

## EXTRAS:

- Umbrella – one that folds up is always nice to have on the go! A rain jacket and rain boots is also not a bad idea.
- Suitcases/Duffels
- Small tool kit (a screwdriver may come in handy more than you would expect)
- ID cards
